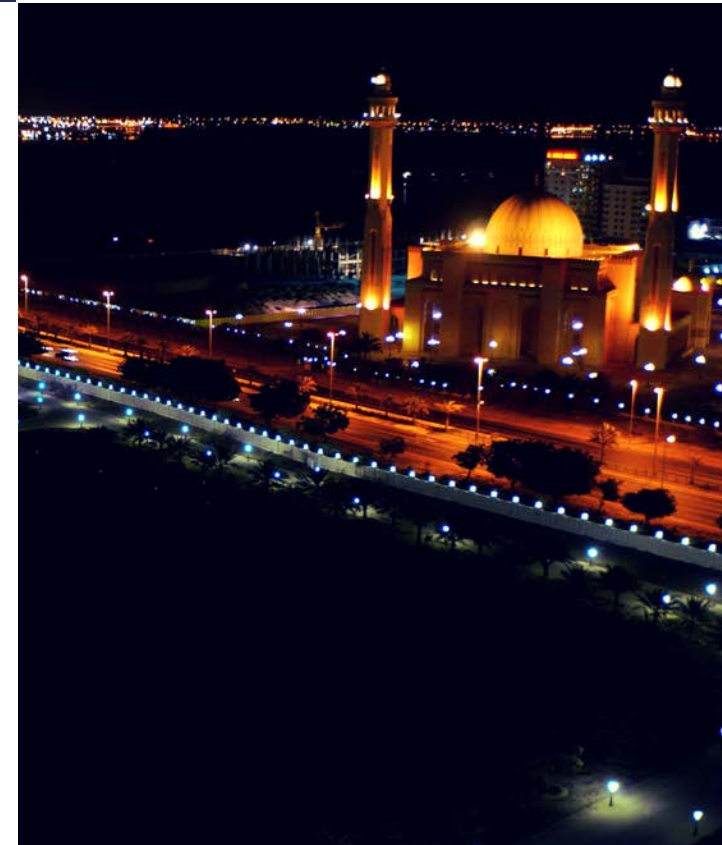


## CULTURAL BAHRAIN
